The Costa Table Series, designed by Mario Ruiz for **HBF**, was created to address the needs of the constantly changing multi-purpose conference area. The series provides reconfigurable modularity and flexibility of use in a simple, intuitive design, while nesting and tilt-up features provide a quick transition to storage. Costa rectangular tables may be ganged together or combined with any of six additional connector shapes to form numerous configurations.

Lime coffee tables, designed by Lime Studio for **Swedese**, feature an elegant simplicity that makes them suitable for both residential and contract interiors. Lime comes in two heights and four shapes: square, rectangular, wedge-shaped and an equilateral triangle. The tables are available with a white or black laminate top and a steel base coated in a white or black lacquer.



The Soho cocktail table from **Schumacher** is suitable for a variety of commercial and residential settings. Soho's oak top and iron base are both available in a variety of finishes (cerused oak finish and glazed and waxed black iron finishes shown), and the table's dimensions are completely customizable to suit any space. It is also available with single or double drawers on one or both sides.



Sparkeology's new Duane computer table makes teaming up with technology simple. This trestle-style table gangs together easily to support multiple computer stations or gaming centers, but can also be used as a freestanding table or along a wall. The large trough accommodates bulky bundles of cords and power strips used for multiple terminals, while the split table top provides more convenient access to cords than traditional grommets.
